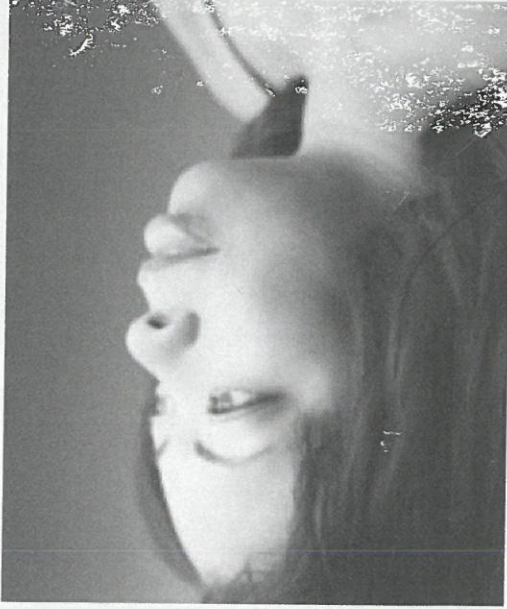

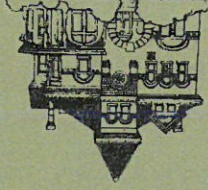

Our Mission

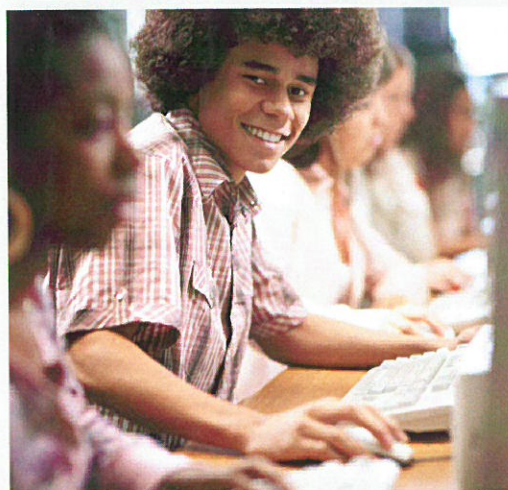
The mission of Lowenstein House is to help persons with mental illnesses work towards recovery and achieve self-sufficiency through job skills training, job placement, life skills development, education, housing, case management and support.

Your Journey to Recovery Begins Here

Lowenstein House is a psychosocial rehabilitation facility serving adults diagnosed with mental illness. It utilizes a clubhouse model approach in which participants are "members" of a club, as opposed to "clients" or "patients". The Clubhouse Model of Psychiatric Rehabilitation asserts that all persons are capable of change and growth. Lowenstein House is committed to this philosophy and provides a program of support, education, recreation and mental health recovery for its participants. Members are encouraged and supported throughout their personal journey of recovery.

Training Units

Lowenstein House has four units in which members can receive job skills training and/or develop activities of daily living. The units are: Food Services, Environmental, Clerical/Computer Technology and Peer Services. Members choose a unit based on their individual needs and goals. Staff assist members with goal setting and provide guidance, training and case management.

MENTAL HEALTH RECOVERY

Promoting mental health recovery is a key component of the Lowenstein House program. Individuals are assisted with developing a WRAP (Wellness Recovery Action Plan), which will assist them with managing their illness and learning how to prevent setbacks. In addition, various groups and other activities are provided to help members develop interpersonal and life skills essential to living productively in the community.
